Inter-Livery Target Rifle Shoot at Bisley

A Livery shooting competition supported by the Livery Companies and the RAF Target Rifle Team raised thousands of pounds for the RAF Benevolent Fund.

The event, which took place on 10th June, was organized by Colin Sach, past Master of the Worshipful Company of Bakers and Wing Commander Chris Hockley, treasurer of the RAF Small Arms Association.

The shoot sees teams from 16 Livery companies compete at five disciplines including Running Boar, Black Powder Pistol and Target Rifle at 1000 yards. This year amongst the 48 attendees was Air Vice Marshal Harvey Smyth, the Ministry of Defence's Director Space UK and President of the RAF Small Arms Association who formed part of the Honourable Company of Air Pilots team.

Wing Commander Chris Hockley said: "It was a great day and went very well. It was fantastic to have Air Vice Marshall Harvey Smyth with us on the day. Most importantly it was great to raise money for the RAF Benevolent Fund to help support RAF personnel, veterans and their families when they most need it."



Hannah Bower from the RAF Benevolent Fund said: "Thank you to all those who took part in the event, over the last nine years the Inter-Livery Target Rifle Shoot has raised many thousands of pounds to help provide financial, practical and emotional wellbeing support for RAF Family members in need." Colin Sach said "Hopefully we will exceed £100,000 raised so far very soon.

We are hoping to run a course for difficult cadets based on some Norwegian work that shows that rifle shooting is good for self-discipline, frustration and similar, and fund it by talking to the companies that sponsor air cadet units."

Bake4Ukraine – Update

Having heard of the great work being carried out by Andriy Vasylenko, Jonathan Mellows MD of Montana Bakeries then shared with his team the videos on YouTube by Bake4Ukraine. They then decided to donate 5 redundant but fully operational ovens to Bake4Ukraine and contacted David Amos to offer this support.

Last week Jason Powell Engineering manager of Zeelandia UK and David Amos met with Jonathan Mellows MD of Montana Bakeries and his team to organise the logistics of delivering 5

redundant ovens to the Ukraine. During the meeting Andriy Vasylenko joined from the Ukraine via WhatsApp and the logistics were quickly agreed.

On weekend of 18th / 19th June the ovens were to be ...ansferred to Zeelandia UK in Colchester, these will then be transported to Zeelandia Poland, together with other bakery equipment collected in the UK. Andriy will then send transport from the Ukraine to Poland to collect and move to the selected bakeries within Ukraine.



During the call Andriy expressed his huge thanks and explained that they are currently working with bakeries across

Ukraine to identify those that can use the equipment quickly as unfortunately there is still a lot of conflict but they have identified a number of areas that have been regained by the Ukrainian army. These areas are in huge need and so are the current focus to get bread production back up and running to help bring back hope and the economy.



Conference at Alton Towers
