LIVERY SOCIETY AGM — with Guest speaker from 45 Squadron RAF



On **Monday 27**th **February** the **Bakers' Livery Society Annual General Meeting** took place in the Court Room at **Bakers Hall**. All Liverymen, Freemen, and Young Bakers are automatically members of the Livery Society and their guests are all most welcome. A **total of 35** people attended.

As has become the habit, the AGM itself took up the minimum of time (max 5 minutes) – and the focus was very much on our guest speaker, Flight Lieutenant Scotty Edmed from 45 Squadron RAF, which is one of the Bakers' military affiliates.

Flt Lt Edmed was in his flying jacket (see **photo above** – with Liveryman Julian Dale, the Bakers' Military Liaison Officer) and gave a **fascinating and very personal talk**,

accompanied by some fantastic slides – most of which were taken by him from his cockpit.

He explained **his own story** of how he came to be at 45 Squadron and how that journey saw him literally travelling around the world – **refuelling fighter jets mid -air** from a Voyager military aircraft (a converted Airbus A330).

He also gave us a **short history of the Squadron** – nicknamed **the Flying Camels,** after its extraordinary success in combat with the Sopwith Camel in the First World War.

Finally, Scotty explained the various ways that the funds the Bakers' Company send the Squadron each year are spent. As examples, towards the design of a Squadron Coin and the refurbishment of Trophies.

Our mutual relationship is highly valued and this was further strengthened by the presentation to the Company by Scotty, on behalf of 45 Squadron, of a framed print of the Squadron - signed by the Squadron members - which also included the new Squadron Coin.

This was very **gratefully received**, on behalf of the Company, **by Past Master Patrick Wilkins** who warmly thanked Scotty for his splendid presentation, which had made for a most enlightening and entertaining evening – a sentiment enthusiastically supported by all present.

A glass of fizz followed by a 2 course buffet supper in the Hall allowed everyone to chat with Scotty, who very kindly agreed to play 'musical chairs' to do so.
